Chamber Supports Police Ballot Measure in November

The Lafayette City Council will most likely place a measure on the November ballot to fund additional patrol officers. Lafayette has the smallest police force per capita in Contra Costa County. Methamphetamine related arrests in Lafayette have more than doubled in two years. Lafayette has easy access to freeways and is an attractive target for burglars and drug users who fence the stolen goods. The cost of police services continue to rise. This cost has become almost 50% of the city's allocation of general funds. The proposal will cost each single family homeowner about 18 cents per day for the next five years. Because 50% of all police services occur in the business district, commercial properties will pay 10 to 30 times that base amount. Adding patrol officers during periods of greatest need will reduce response times, which can be as long as 20-30 minutes.

Securing this additional protection in Lafayette will require 2/3 approval from the voters. The Lafayette Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors have endorsed this measure. Look for upcoming details on this measure.

Prop 81 Highlights

The State Legislature has placed a \$600 million statewide library bond on the June, 2006 ballot.

- This bond will provide a 35% local and 65% state match in funding for grant recipients.
- Grants will be awarded for a minimum of \$50,000 and a maximum of \$20 million.
- First priority will be given to eligible applications not funded in the 3rd application cycle of Proposition 14. The amount awarded for these first priority projects may not exceed 50% of the \$600 million authorized.
- The remaining \$300 million of funds not awarded for the 3rd application cycle will be awarded on a statewide competitive basis.
- At least \$25 million will be made available for joint use projects with one or more public education institutions (K-12 school district, county office of education, community college district, a campus of California State University or a campus of the University of California).


